## Crossing the ocean to serve

As soon as the first August rolled around, the women were on their way to school to prepare for the upcoming soccer season. They dedicated themselves to the sport, practicing three to four times daily out in the intense heat.

A few adjustments had to be made as the season began. First of all, the women had a new coach, Brett Armstrong, who brought a new spirit and a different perspective to the team. Second, the team started the season with only two subs on the bench, a situation which created the need to recruit. As the season progressed, the team added new players, an improvement which kept fresh bodies rotating in and out of the field and made it easier to keep up with the opponent and pull through with the victory.

In practice the women did several drills, trying to incorporate game-like situations. They also played small-sided games and split into offense and defense for posi-tion-specific drills. When it came time for game time, the women played a warm-up CD to get pumped up as they completed their warm-up routine. Throughout each game, the women pulled together and put teamwork into practice and gave their all.

Over the course of the season, the women all grew closer and overcame a lot of obstacles. They were determined to have a great season and to finish strong. They completed their season with an astonishing 6-0 win over Freed-Hardeman. Tournament for the fifth time in school history and made it to the region semifinals, finishing the season with a 26-10 overall record and 13-5 in TranSouth play. The 26-wins record is the fourth highest season in school history, resulting in the seventh time head coach Scott Jones has produced a 20 -win season. Before the season ended the team produced other exciting victories in games against Crichton College (pre-season nationally ranked \#2), the University of the Cumberlands, Cumberland University, and Freed Hardeman. After losing twice to Martin Methodist, the team proved its mettle by defeating Martin in the semifinal game of the TranSouth Conference Tournament. The men made their third Sweet Sixteen appearance at the NAIA National Tournament, ending the season with a two-point loss to Georgetown. Their positive performances earned team members significant awards. Josh Helton was named to the NAIA All-National Tournament Team. Josh and Collins Onyando earned All-American honorable mentions. Josh and Collins were also named to the TranSouth Athletic Conference (TSAC) First Team, and Jeremy Dixon was named to the TSAC All-Freshman Team. Christopher Harris was named NAIA Scholar-Athlete, and Adam Drake, Matthew Elliott, and Christopher Harris won TSAC Student-Athlete Awards. Matt Eliott won the Most Improved Player Award; Josh Helton and Collins Onyando were named Co-Most Valuable Players. Four members of the team earned places in the elite 1,000 -Point Club during the 2007-2008 season: Josh Helton; Collins Onyando; Marcos Salvi; and Brian Oduor, who joined that group during his junior year. Brian also led the nation in field-goal percentage. In addition to these individual honors, the team led the NAIA in two categories: fieldgoal percentage and three-point percentage.

The win over Blue Mountain College on January 28, 2008 was a big win for Head Coach Sam Harris, his 400th win as a coach. This year Harris completed his eighth con-
secutive winning season and his fourth 20-win season.

TThe Trevecca Nazarene University women's basketball team seemed to have a stacked deck heading into this season. The team returned four all-conference performers in Mariska Reed, Kristin Archie, Jennifer Bognar, and Abbie Lawson.

The team produced an exciting season for the Lady Trojan fans, finishing the season with a 23-12 record and a trip to the NAIA National Tournament at Oman Arena, in Jackson, Tennessee.

In the NAIA's 32-team bracket for the 28th Annual NAIA Division-I Women's Basketball National Championship, Trevecca's women's team received one of four No. 6 seeds. At that tournament the Lady Trojans were victorious against Southern Nazarene University, Langston University, Loyola University, and Freed-Hardeman and made it to the final game of the tournament.
