Prologue from the President



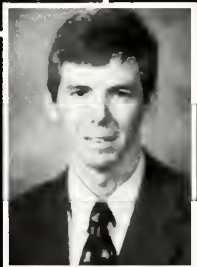
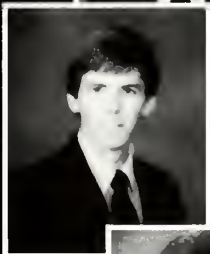
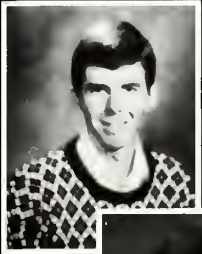

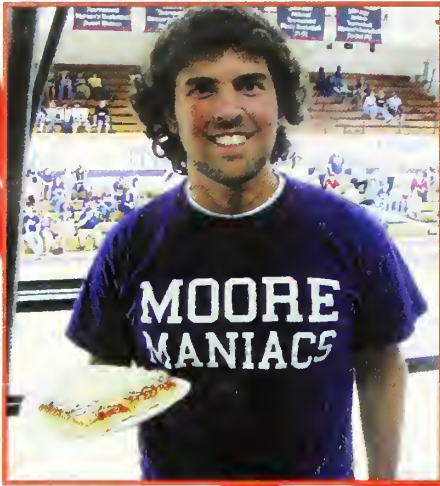

All-School Retreat

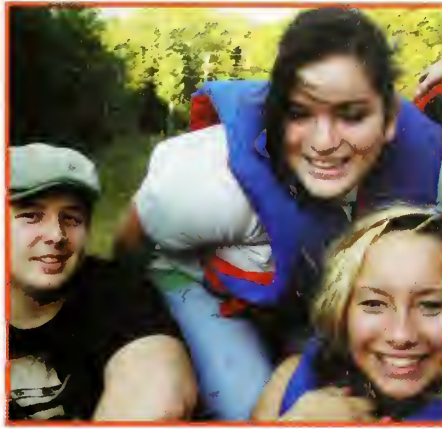
Getting away never felt so good.

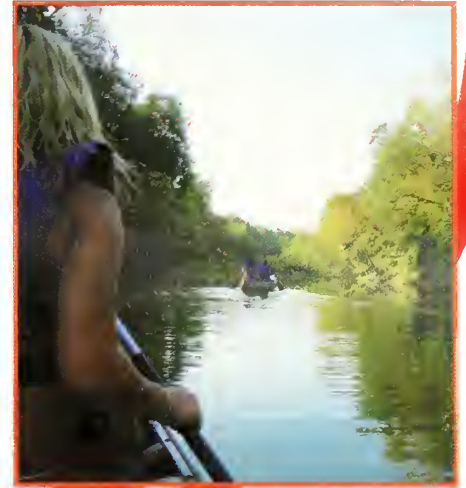

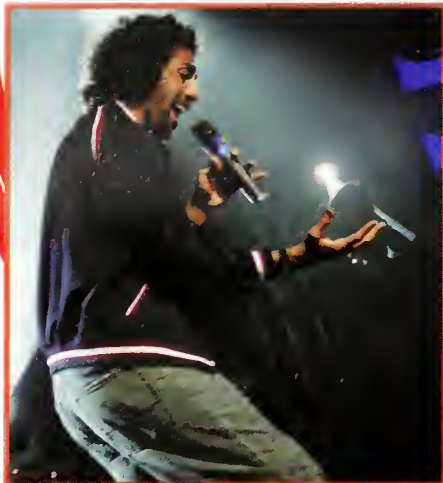

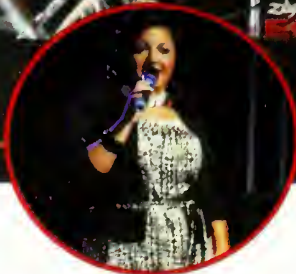


Finalist and the only female freshman of the night, Brittany Daugherty, stunned the crowd with her fresh talent.

TNU’s Most Eligible Bachelor—Tim Leiphart!



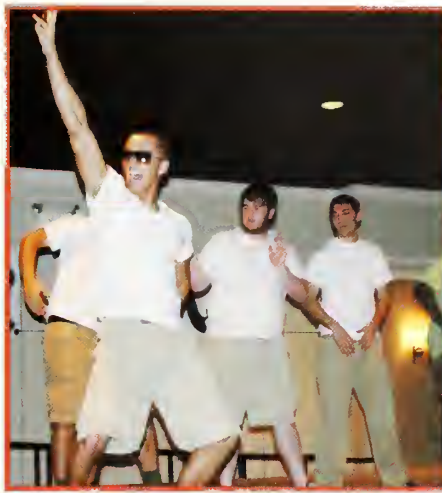

Mr. TNU himself, Tim Leiphart, for the talent portion decided to share with the desperate guys of Trevecca his "10 Tips to Get Chicks."

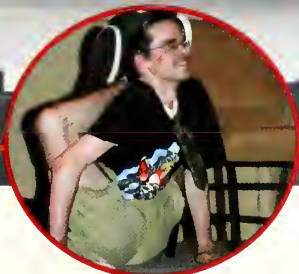

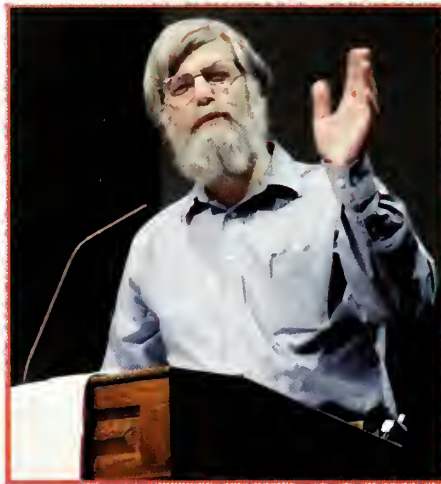

108th Commencement

Record number of graduates in 2009



Trevecca's 2009 Commencement ceremonies took place on May 2, 2009, after a night of rain and a soggy start to the morning. When weather conditions appeared to be changing, administrators decided that conditions would—after all—permit the ceremonies to be held outdoors. With seating prepared for 6,700 persons, an outdoor ceremony allowed all family and friends of graduates to be able to be present.

Education professor Stella Simpson delivered the challenge to graduates, and responses came from three graduates: Matt Taylor, representing traditional undergraduates; Josh Carlson, representing degree-completion graduates; and Marvin Jones, representing graduate students.

Degrees were awarded to 872 graduates, a new Trevecca record.

An honorary doctorate was presented to Steve Harris, associate provost and dean of student development, in recognition of his 30 years of service to Trevecca.

The Citizenship Award, the highest award presented to an undergraduate, was presented to Drew Vinson.

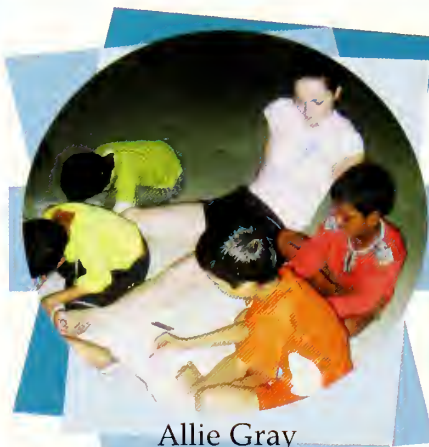

One group of students went to Mumbai, India. In this city, half of the population lives in the slums. Trevecca students spent one month

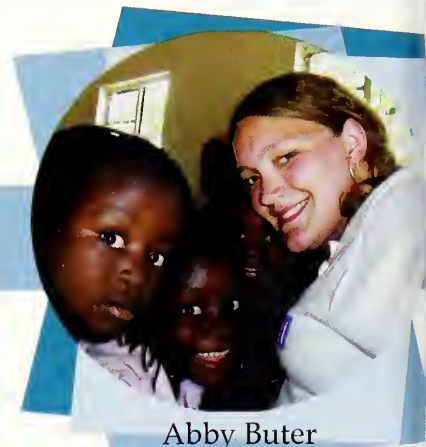

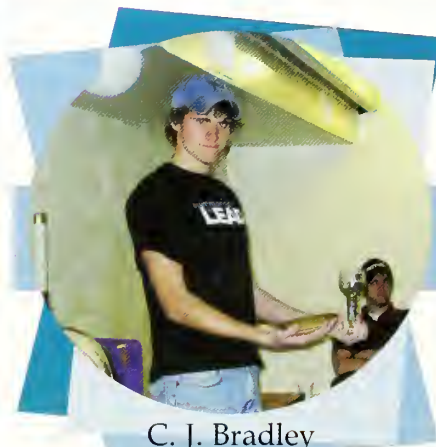

Trevecca's women's soccer team faced a number of difficulties at the beginning of its season. The primary difficulty was the loss of experienced team members. "We had a very young team," explained Coach Brett Armstrong. "We had no seniors and 14 new players on the team; ten were freshman and four were transfers." With senior leadership absent and the majority of players new to the team and college life, Coach Armstrong knew that the first priority would be to build relationships between the returning players and the incoming ones. Training started in the summer, long before there were any signs of life on campus. Since the first objective was to connect as a team, the beginning of training consisted of team-building exercises, such as spending time at a ropes course and canoeing the Harpeth River together.

The relationships began to solidify and become stronger in competition. One of the biggest wins was in overtime against Cumberland, a victory which put the team in the TranSouth Conference Tournament. Playing in that tournament

had been a team goal from the beginning of the season. Injuries began to take a toll on the team, and Trevecca ended up losing to Lyon in the first round of the tournament. Even though their overall record was 4-15, players drew strength from the knowledge that they had overcome some major difficulties. Next season they will bring their experience back to the field, where they "hope to build upon their work and success this next season."

New records set in the 2008-2009 season

The Trevecca women's softball team was happy to welcome Ben Tyree as its new head coach, following the resignation of Ernie Reynolds. After losses early in the season, the team came back to overpower Mid-Continent, Union, and Tennessee Wesleyan Universities. One of its most impressive wins was achieved on Senior Day, when Trevecca faced Lyon College in a make-up game; the Lady Trojans came back in the last inning to win the game, 4-3. Trevecca earned the fourth seed in the TranSouth Tournament, and after losing to Bethel, ended up in the elimination bracket, where they were defeated by Cumberland.

Senior Chelsea Bailey left Trevecca with new records, including most hits in a career (294) and most triples in a season (8) and career (18). Overall, she broke nine records at Trevecca. She was named TranSouth Player of the Year and was given a place on the TranSouth First Team along with Karli Rush and Riley Mashburn. Stephanie Fisher was awarded a place on the TranSouth Second Team.

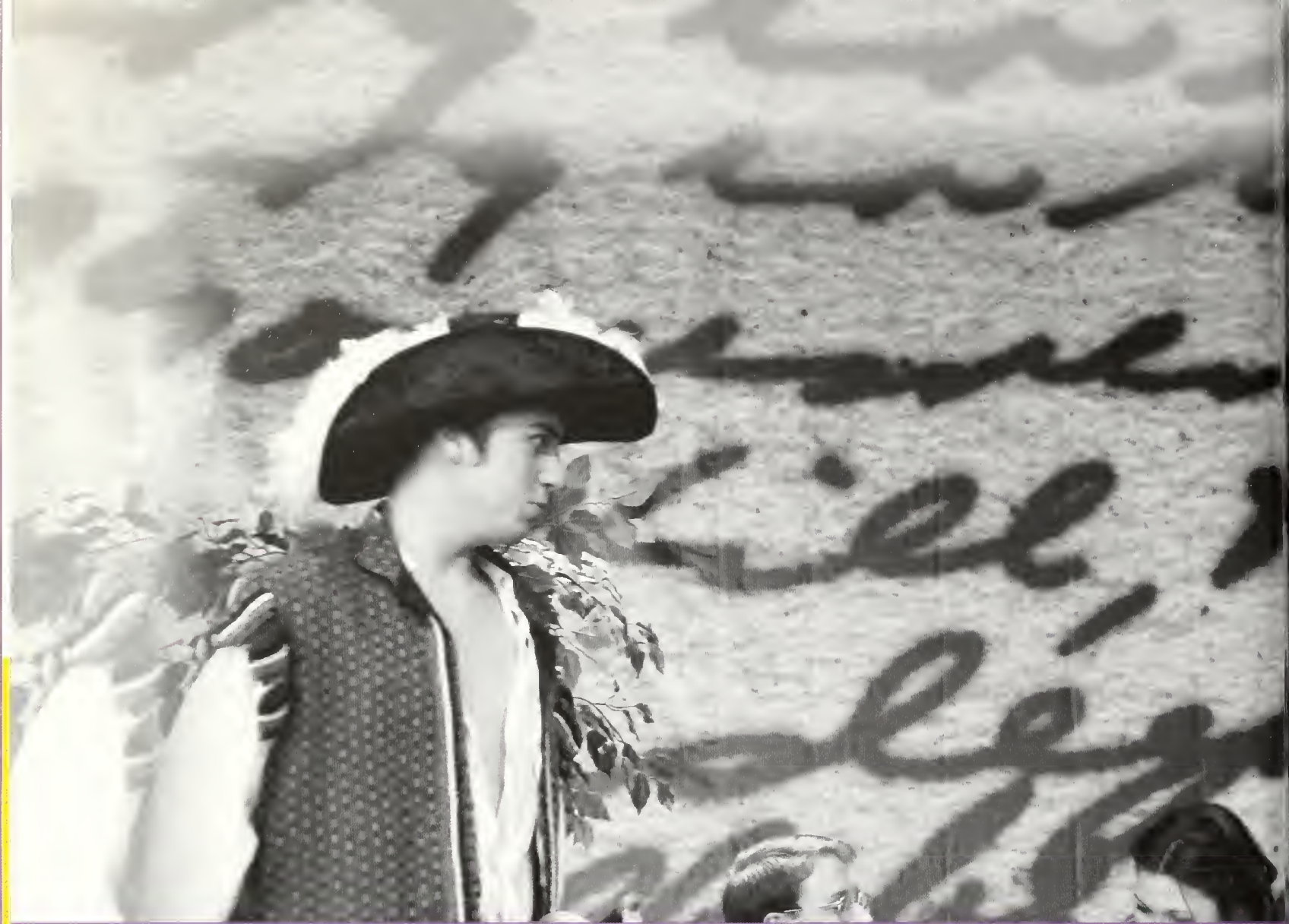

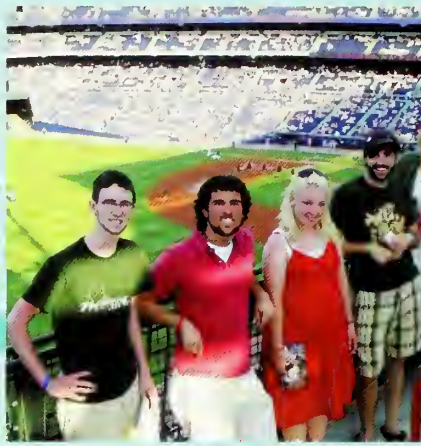

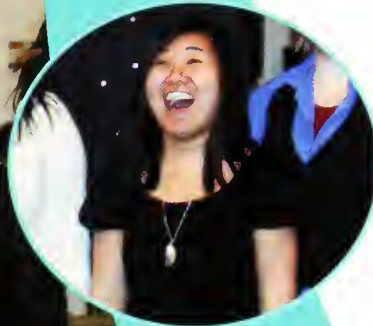

Little Women

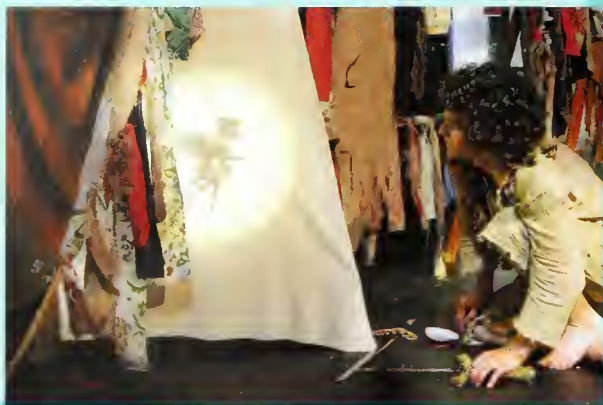
