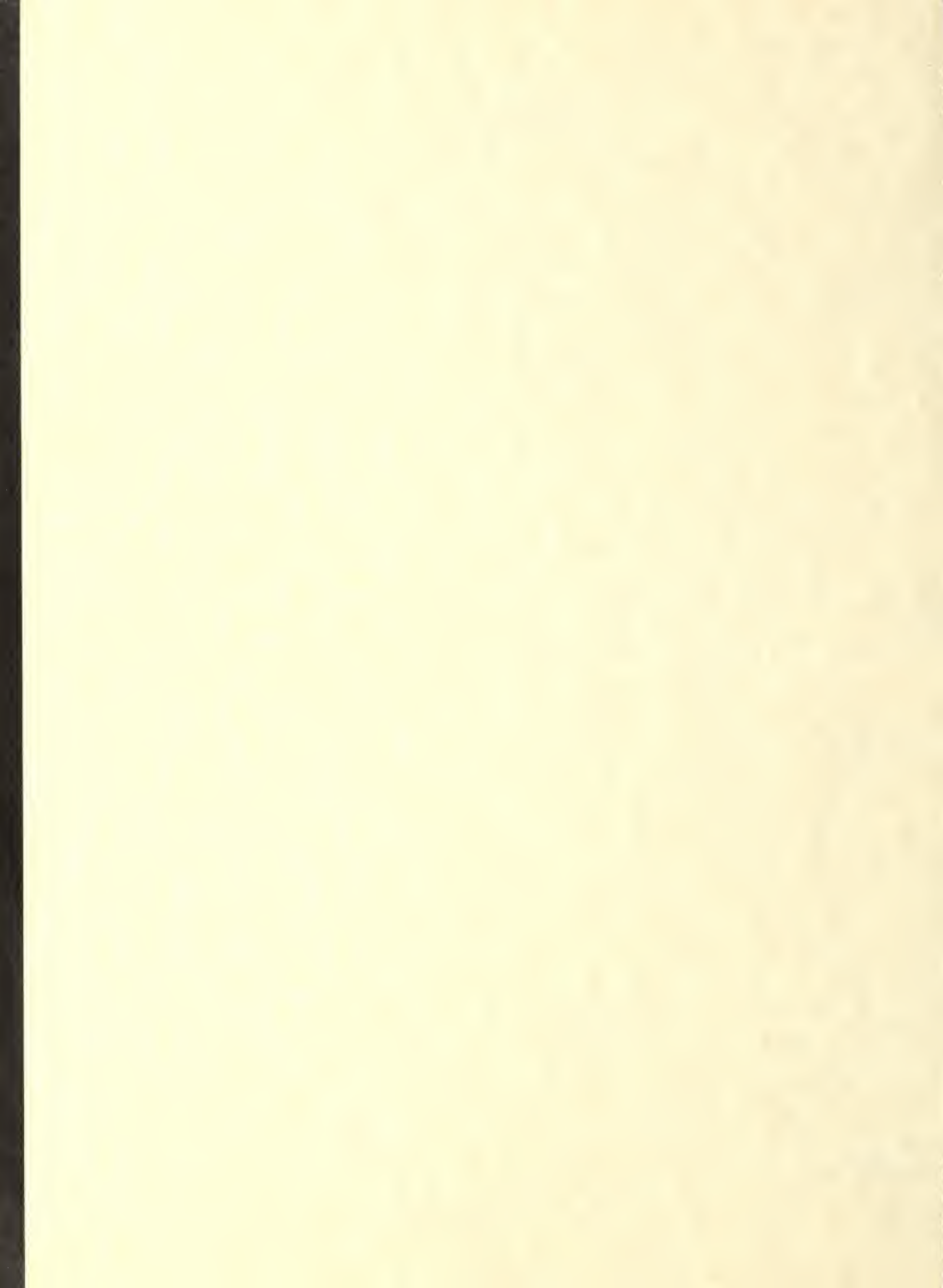

Kicking the year off right!

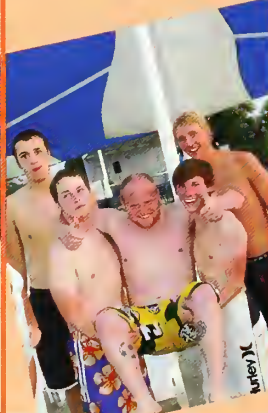


# WELCOME WEEK

Trojan Idol contestants wait in suspense to see who the top five were for the second night of Trojan Idol.

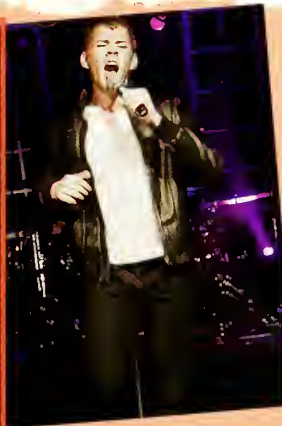

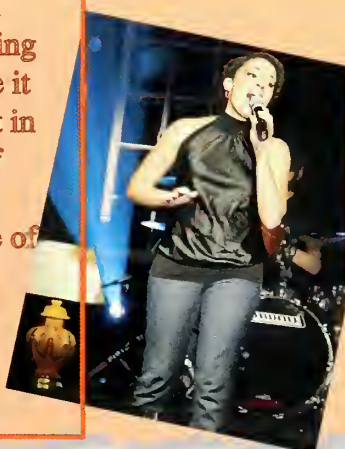

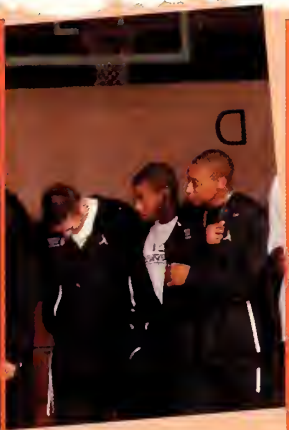
Trevecca celebrates homecoming around the world!

Some of them spend their summer working with Youth in Mission, an organization that gives college students who sense a call to missions the opportunity to travel to countries that are in need of their help. 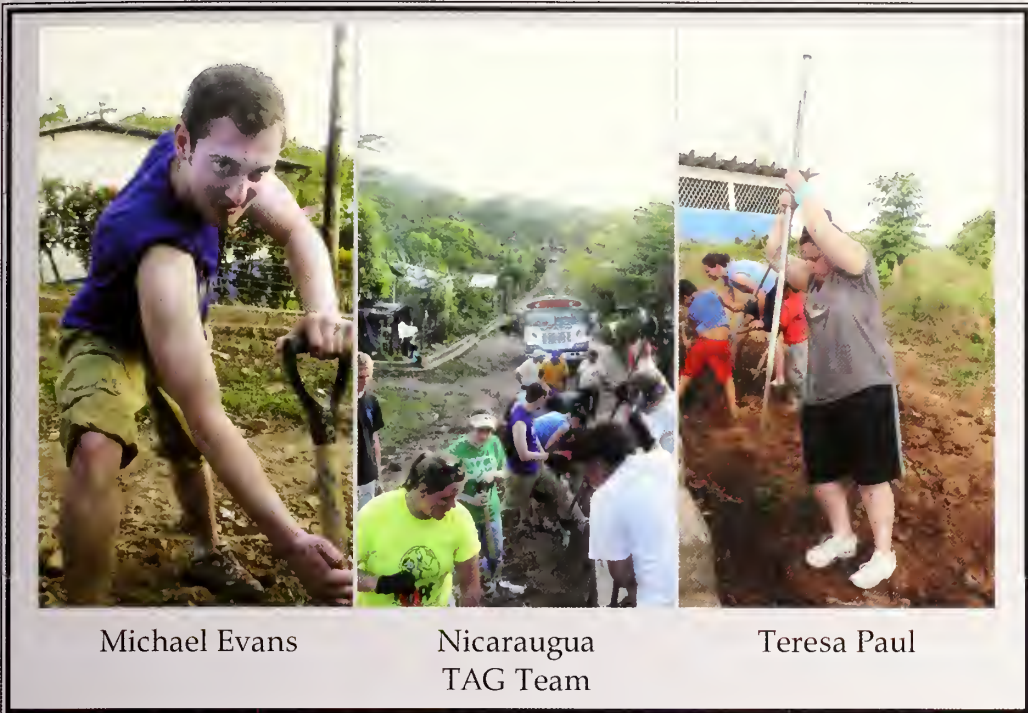

Trevecca Around the Globe in Poland and Nicaragua

As they enter college, students begin to broaden their horizons, figuratively and literally. Trevecca has always strived to aid young adults in their quest to connect with people who may seem to be completely different from them but who share a bond in Christ that overcomes all obstacles. Trevecca Around the Globe (TAG) is a program that gives students and faculty the opportunity to

experience and enhance life in other parts of the world. This past

summer a team of 12 traveled to Gdansk, Poland, to help with repairs at a local school and coffee shop run by Nazarene missionaries. Another team visited Nicaragua, where they held a vacation Bible school for the children and handed out medical supplies to the village. This school year students have the opportunity to travel to and minister in Memphis, Jamaica, Nicaragua, and Peru. When Trevecca students reach out into the world, there will always be a change: in our views, in the way we live, and in the way we reach out again.

**A**ttending a Christian college provides special opportunities for students who seek to draw closer to God. Chapel is designed so that every student has a chance to experience God and to seek God's will for their lives when they participate in worship. Chapel is offered four times a week: Didache on Monday nights emphasizes teaching and discussion; Koinonia on Tuesday and Thursday offers worship and a message, and Kerygma on Wednesday features student preaching and participation in communion. Each explores and emphasizes different acts of worship.

Journey into Wholeness, this year's theme, stressed ways for students to live fulfilling lives. Spiritual Deepening Week with Rick Harvey, the relationship series with Michael Christian and Marnie Feree and Jan Harvey, and the "Wholeness and Alcohol" hot topic discussion with President Boone were a few of the many different chapels that communicated to students that a life lived with Christ is a whole and satisfying one.

Trevecca has many programs to address different needs—here and around the world. For years, King's Kids, a student-led effort, has been reaching into the neighborhood surrounding the campus and touching the lives of children who deserve Christian influences and positive role models. This year's leaders, Theresa Jones and Nicole Crofford, are passionate about meeting the needs of children in the Trevecca neighborhood. They have enlisted many volunteers who are dedicated to making sure the children are exposed to God's love through Bible stories, crafts, and games and by witnessing their enthusiasm about God's will for their lives. They lead 100 children each Tuesday night for a VBS-like event. The team also plans special treats for the holidays, including Trunk or Treat and a Thanksgiving dinner. The leaders hope to increase the number of their volunteers so that King's Kids can reach even more children. "We believe God has great things in store for King's Kids," confidently states Theresa, as she and the rest of the team pray that God will bring in more kids next year.

At Trevecca, it is understood that students long to have a closer relationship with God but find it difficult, between classes and studying, to give him an hour of their time. Merge, a small, student-led Bible study group, was created in the hopes that if the students are allowed to meet when they decide they can relationships will grow and become stronger, not only with God, but also with others in their group. Merge is laid-back, with each group given the freedom to pick what members want to focus on. This year there were 23 Merge groups meeting together, each one different, yet focusing on the same core idea that each binds each one together: that while we are unworthy, God still extends his love to us. With each meeting we students remind each other of this fact and support one another each week as we continue to walk God's path for our lives.

# SPRING TAG TRIP

Spending spring break serving in Jamaica, mon!



This spring a group of Trevecca students spent their spring break helping and serving a few of the many needs in Jamaica. The team consisted of Vera Pendergraft, Hilary Frame, Delaina Lantz, Katie Gibson, Jotham Miller, Scottia Davis, Jonathan Hopper, Chelsea Brown, Danielle Kelly, Tiffany Thornton, Erin Greer, Seth Thompson, and Amy Murphy.

Trevecca students and faculty who participated in a mission trip to Jamaica during spring break said that God's work can be done any time of the year, not just during the summer. The team traveled to Frome, where they worked with other teams on a medical center that was near completion. They stayed in the home of the district superintendent of the West Jamaica District and his wife. They also spent time with area children where they were staying. Bringing with them kites, side walk chalk, and bubbles, the group ministered to the kids by spending time with them and sharing in their joy at the simple toys. During their free time, they visited the Negril beach, where they snorkeled, visited a local craft fair, and went cliff jumping.

About her experience in Jamaica, Vera Pendergraft expressed her awe of the people she met: "We met the most honest and vulnerable, yet humbling people. We sat through a four-hour church service Sunday morning, and while we glanced at the clock every five minutes, the people surrounding us gave it all to God. They dedicated the entire day to him with a full understanding that they are completely dependent on him. You always hear that those with nothing give all they have, but it doesn't really hit you until you see it for yourself. It doesn't sink in until you see a man who can barely stand up in church walking a mile down the road just to get there or until you sit down to eat a meal prepared by a man who doesn't always have enough to feed himself."

Ministry to those outside of Trevecca has been an integral part of its students' lives for many years. This year, Jerry Romasco, the student chaplain, added new projects to the usual ones, such as Habitat for Humanity. Through the addition of the Social Justice Program, students have had many opportunities for other projects to help others; one big project was the effort to provide personal hygiene kits to be sent to Haiti after the earthquake. At the beginning of the spring semester, Jerry supervised the Week of Service, a week of service opportunities that included Creation Care/Prayer Walk, Carry Your Cross, and service to the Towers. The projects gave students ways to show care and concern for others. Jerry Romasco summed up the projects' importance: "Relationships are formed, whether that is with someone we are serving or the earth. The process simply is there is something that we can do to help, so from there we get the word out. A service project is worth it when the faith participants have adhered to is made flesh and they can touch, smell, taste, see and/or hear it."

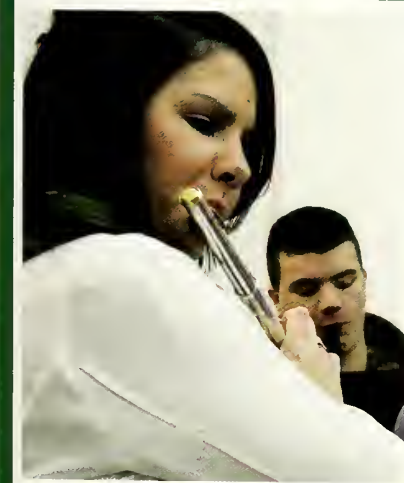

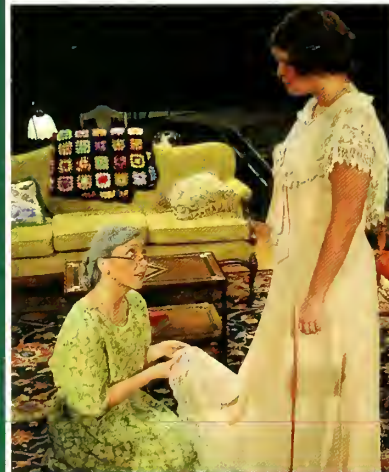

# The Glass Menagerie

Spring Drama Prouduction

Trevecca's drama department stunned its audience once again—but in a brand new way. Department head and play director Jeff Frame chose to begin the spring drama season with *The Glass Menagerie*, a play with an extremely small cast and a seating arrangement that many audience members had not experienced before. Frame chose it not only because it offers a new experience for both actors and audience but because it addresses timeless themes that speak to all ages.

The play attendance was small, a change which was both planned and unplanned. Planned because the seating in the round permitted only a small audience at each performance. Unplanned because Nashville's biggest snow of the season occurred on opening

night, and only students who live on campus could get to the performance. Frame confessed his desire for the intimacy of a smaller crowd, saying that the small audience and centrally located stage would make attendees feel as though they were a part of the performance.

Speaking to all who attended, Jeff Frame said, "I often ask what kind of 'redemption,' if any, comes down to us from what most of us consider to be the great canon of modern American masterpieces for the stage. [Tennessee] Williams's plays are among those I question. And yet, in that urgent 'need to tell'—the cleansing, the purging which comes from passing on our stories—there is a kind of redemption in the telling.

"Certainly this play testifies

to that odd but familiar coupling of loss and hope together—a cautionary tale of self-preservation and unfulfilled dreams; on the one hand; a story of love, tangible sacrifice, and hope on the other. TNU's production this year embraced both in order that we might grow in the wrestling and, in the end, thrive."

## Trevecca Intramural Association

Trevecca Intramural Association (TIA) offers sports opportunities outside of the University's intercollegiate program. TIA is able to provide a unique set of activities that includes among other games dodgeball, wiffleball, flag football, ultimate Frisbee, and sand volleyball. To kick off the school year, Josh Mackens, the TIA commissioner, set up the traditional all-school game of dodgeball during Welcome Week. He also put together a one-night-only game of speed kickball.

# Students Aid in Flood Relief Efforts



When Nashville was flooded the first weekend of May, Trevecca students went to work to meet the needs of those displaced by the flood waters. Working with Hands-on Nashville and the Red Cross, they helped community members set up a shelter in Bellevue Middle School and staffed it around the clock from its opening on Sunday evening, May 2. They continued to work that shelter in six-hour shifts. They also helped in the shelter operated by Lipscomb University. Another group helped the Church of the Nazarene in Gallatin move furniture after its building was flooded that weekend. In the afternoon they assisted at the shelter operated by the Shriner's Temple.

A group of students worked throughout the week in the Chestnut Hill neighborhood directly behind Trevecca. They gutted apartments, cleaned out houses, and sorted through the food at Star Ministries. Aside from the local community, students helped professors and fellow classmates whose houses were also affected by the flood.

With their classes cancelled and even as exams resumed, students used their free time to volunteer wherever they were needed as the City of Nashville began its recovery efforts from the weekend flooding.
