Four years at NNC have created many memories. Jimmie Linn II said this year was his favorite because "living off campus with my friends [has] been a lot easier and not as restrictive."

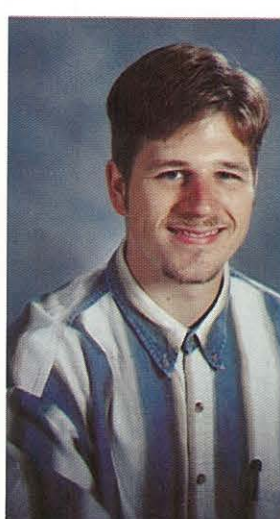

A Journey of Spiritual Growth

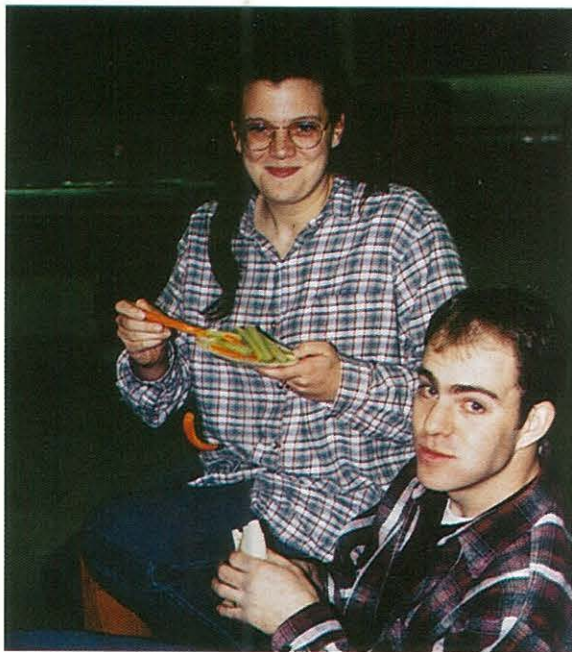

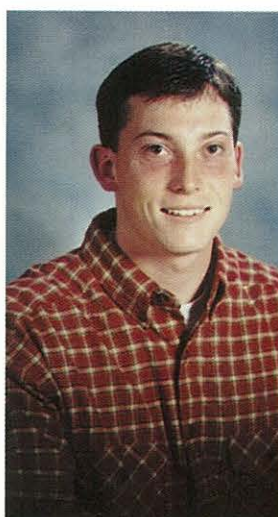
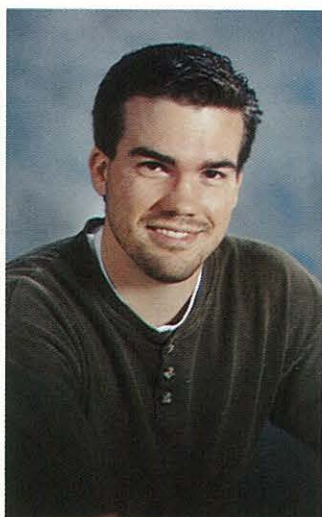

Showing Off Their Cooking Styles

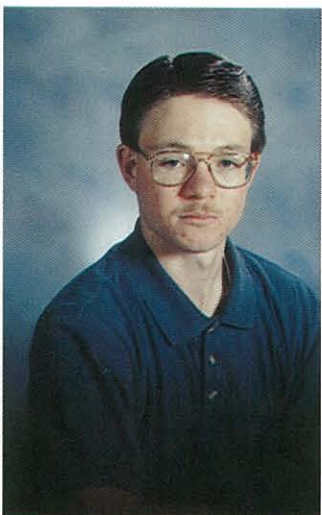

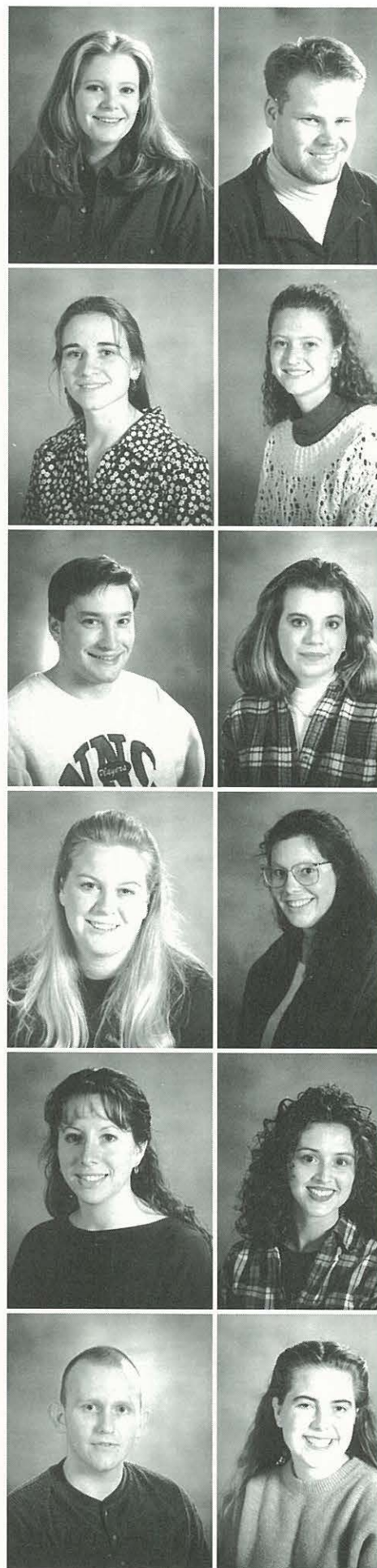
Dooley was a gathering place and a study haven. It was a table joining a circle of friends, a Christmas party held on a winter night, and a comfortable place to call home.

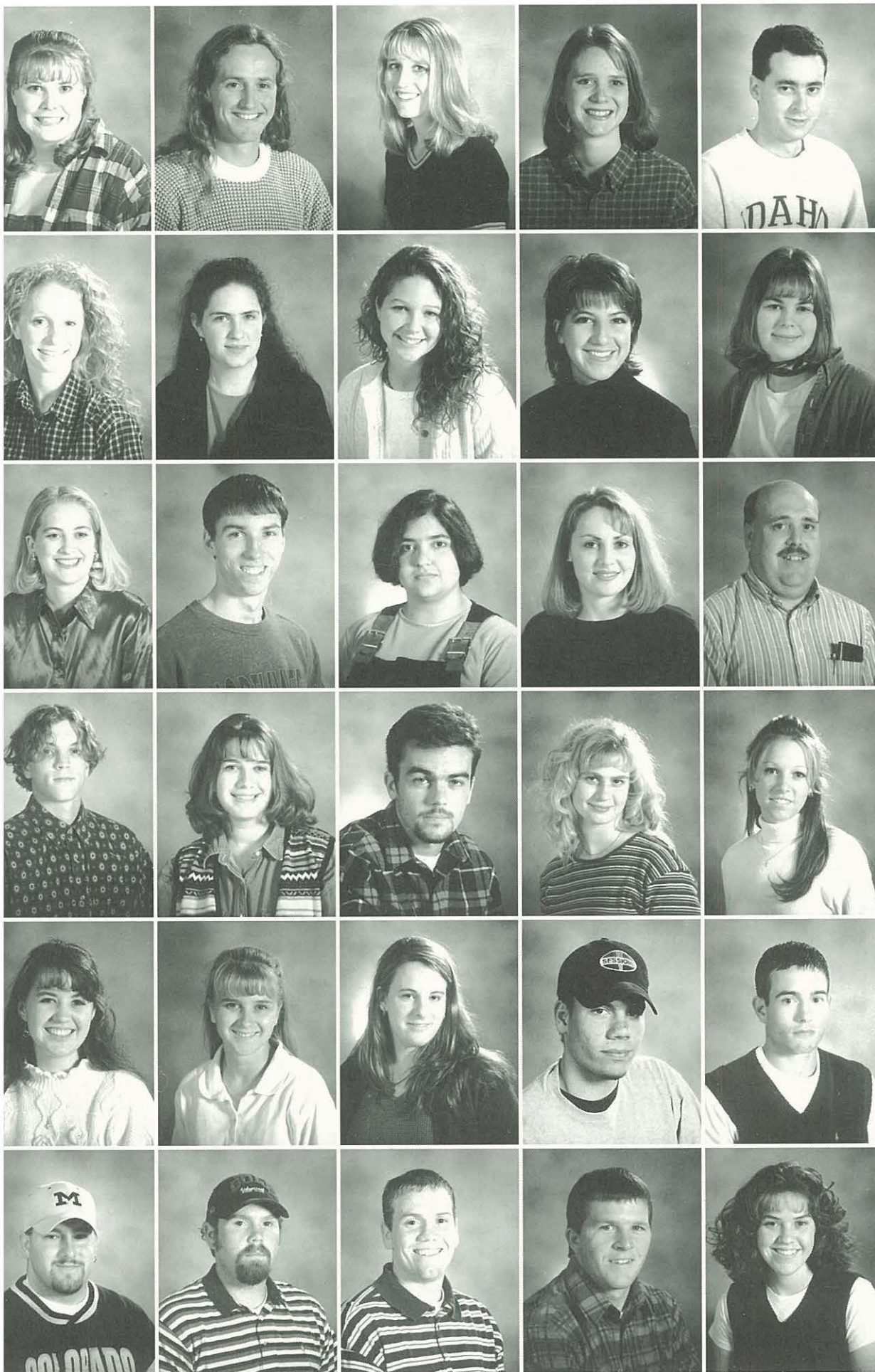

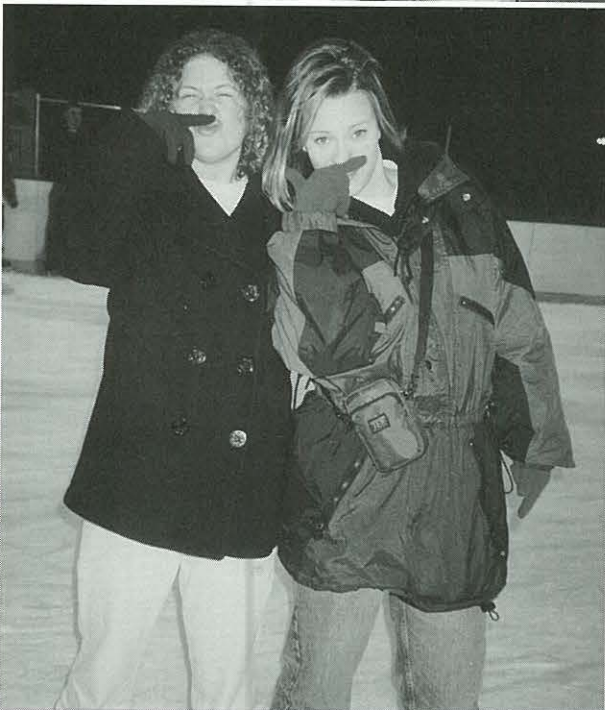
on the quest

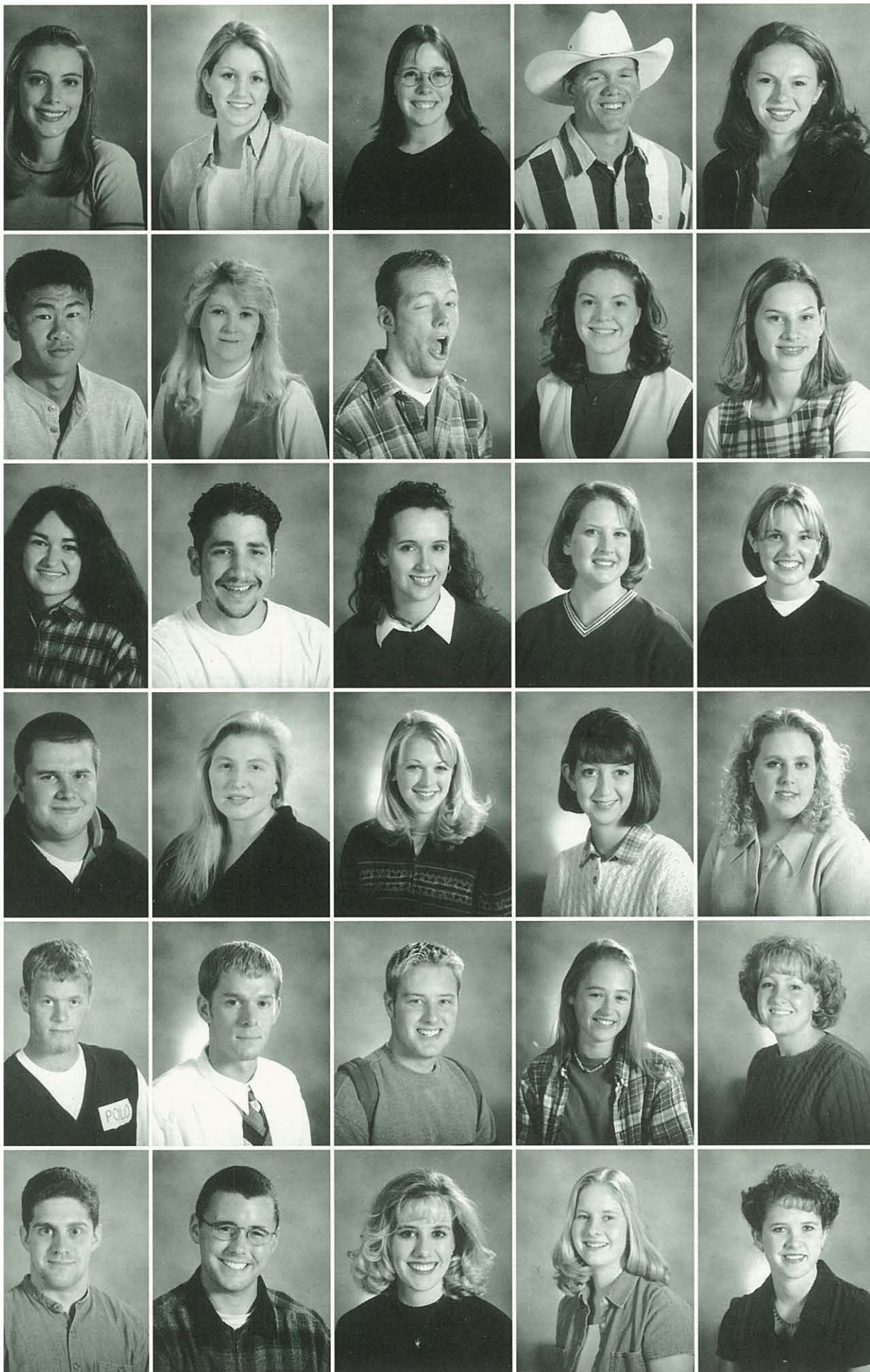

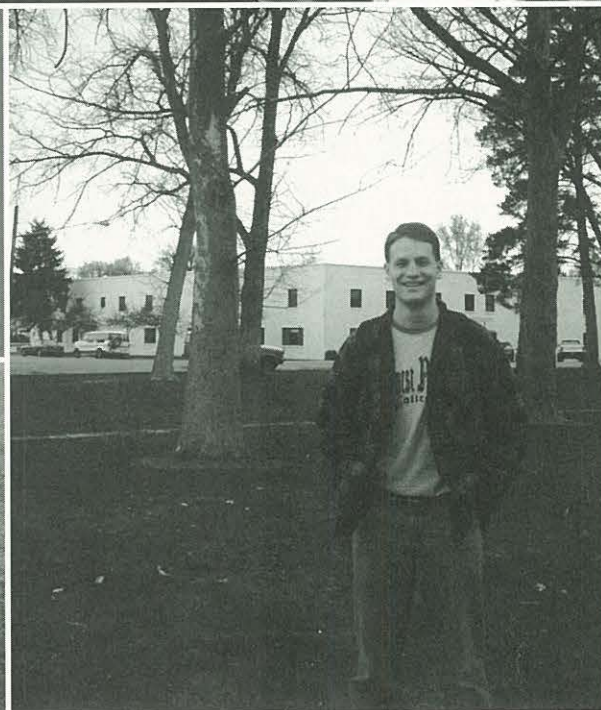
going in depth

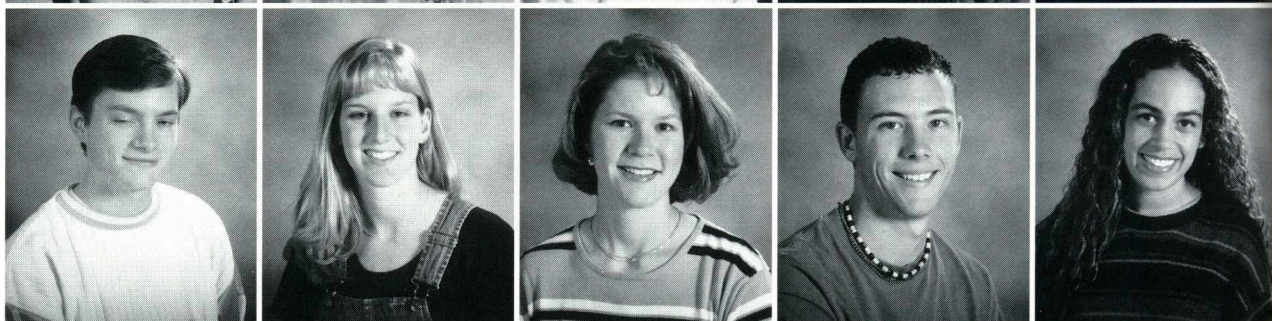

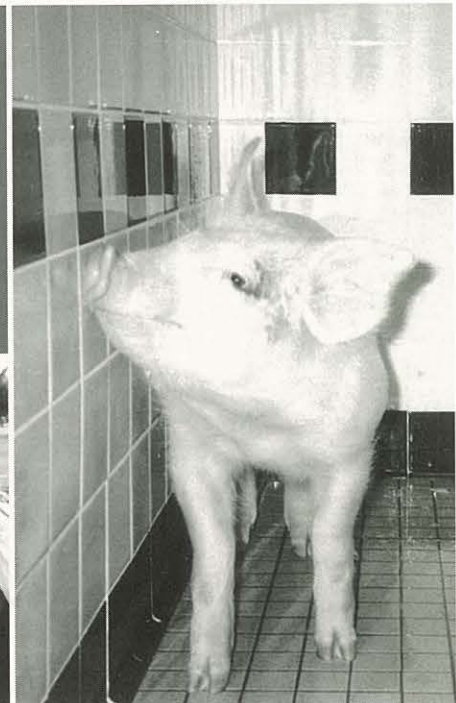
pull a prank

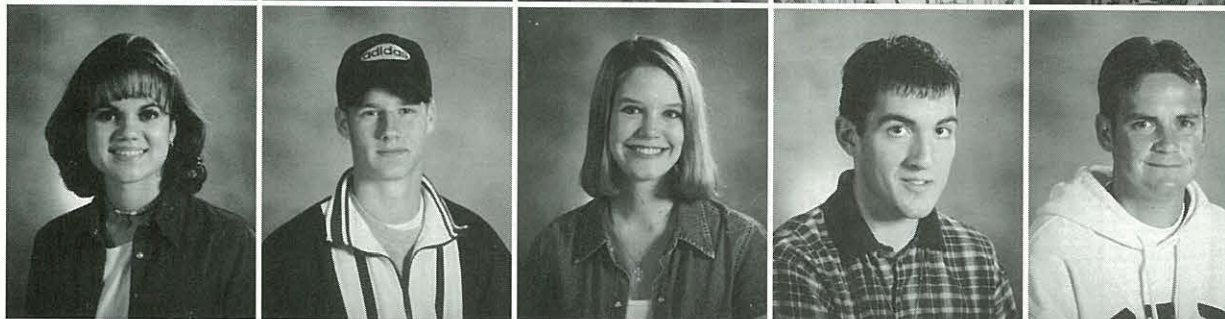

As we moved through the narrow canyon, our raft began to bounce from boulder to boulder. One person in our raft was ejected unceremoniously and completed the ride through pinball all on his own. Eventually, our passenger was retrieved, the rapids all navigated, and our part returned safely to the base station. It was a grand experience!

I recall greeting new students and their families during New Student Orientation in September 1996 by comparing the college years to white water rafting on the Arkansas River. The college experience can be a time when we might feel bounced about from boulder to boulder. It is often a brand new experience not only in higher education, but also in developing maturity for adulthood. The college provides experienced guides who have been through this phase of the journey many times. Our peers often add encouragement as you go through the years together.

At its best, the college experience at Northwest Nazarene College is designed to

instill a habit of mind and a way of living which will enable us to live productive and purposeful lives beyond college. Steven Garber, in his 1996 book *The Fabric of Faithfulness*, reported on research he conducted on successful Christian living beyond the Christian college years. He identified three specific factors which made the Christian college experience a unique and marvelous preparation for life: (1) the development of a world view and a way of life which makes sense of the entirety of life and brings to the person a coherence between belief and behavior; (2) the influence of mentors and models who

demonstrate Christian character; and (3) the maturation of the Christian life through interaction of those with like commitments to ethical and moral integrity. Garber used three words to describe these factors: convictions, character, and community. This is what NNC is about!

Most everyone, I suppose, from time to time, feels bounced around from one difficulty to another. It seems to be part of our human experience. My prayer for you all, however, is that as we go through life's journey, our dependence will be upon Jesus Christ whose guidance and support through the journey will enable us to keep our concentration on life eternal. Being a Christian will not save us from the bumps and bruises of life, but it can give us a habit of mind and a way of living which goes beyond success to significance.

My prayer for the students of Northwest Nazarene College is that all will be persons of conviction, character and community. May God bless you all!

tion. In addition, the Northwesterners took their turn for overseas touring this year by traveling to England in June.



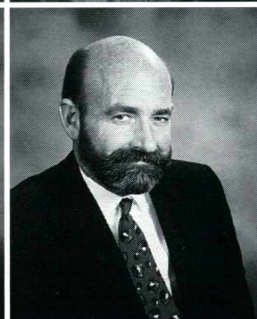
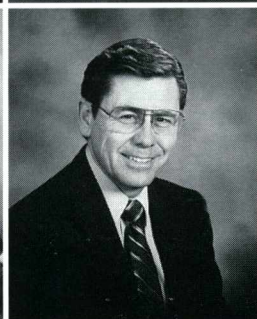
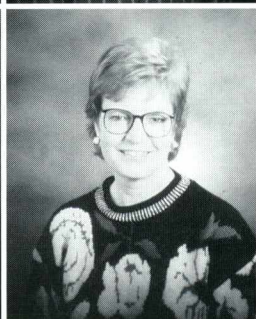
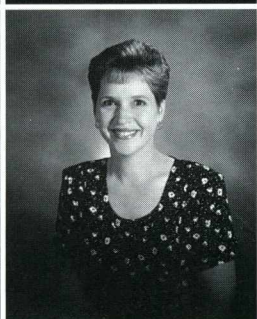
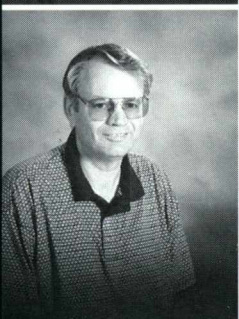

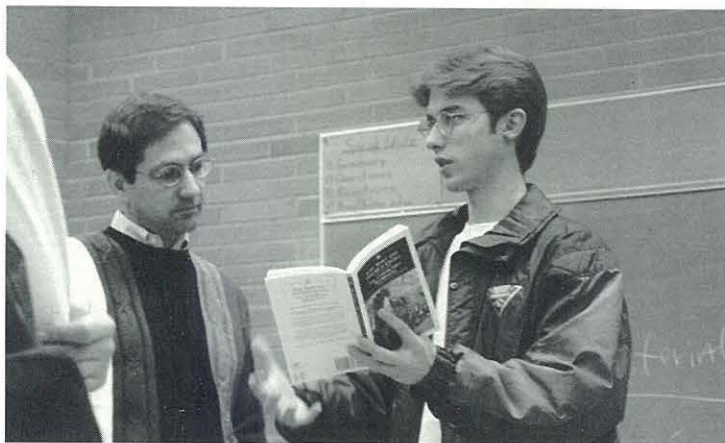


The Division of Social Science

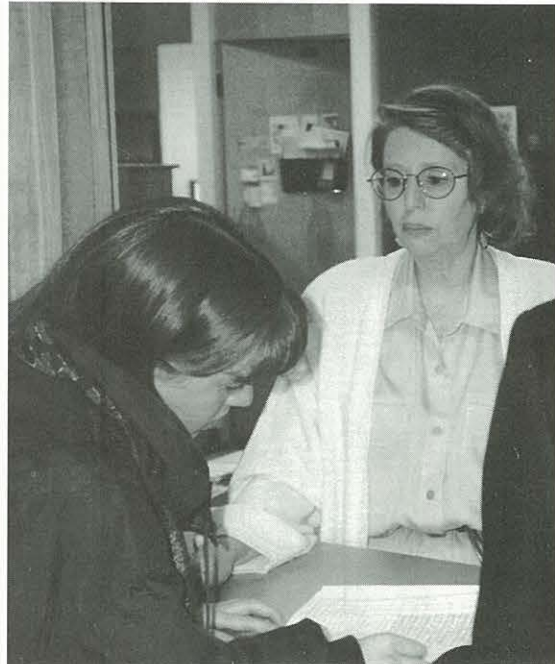

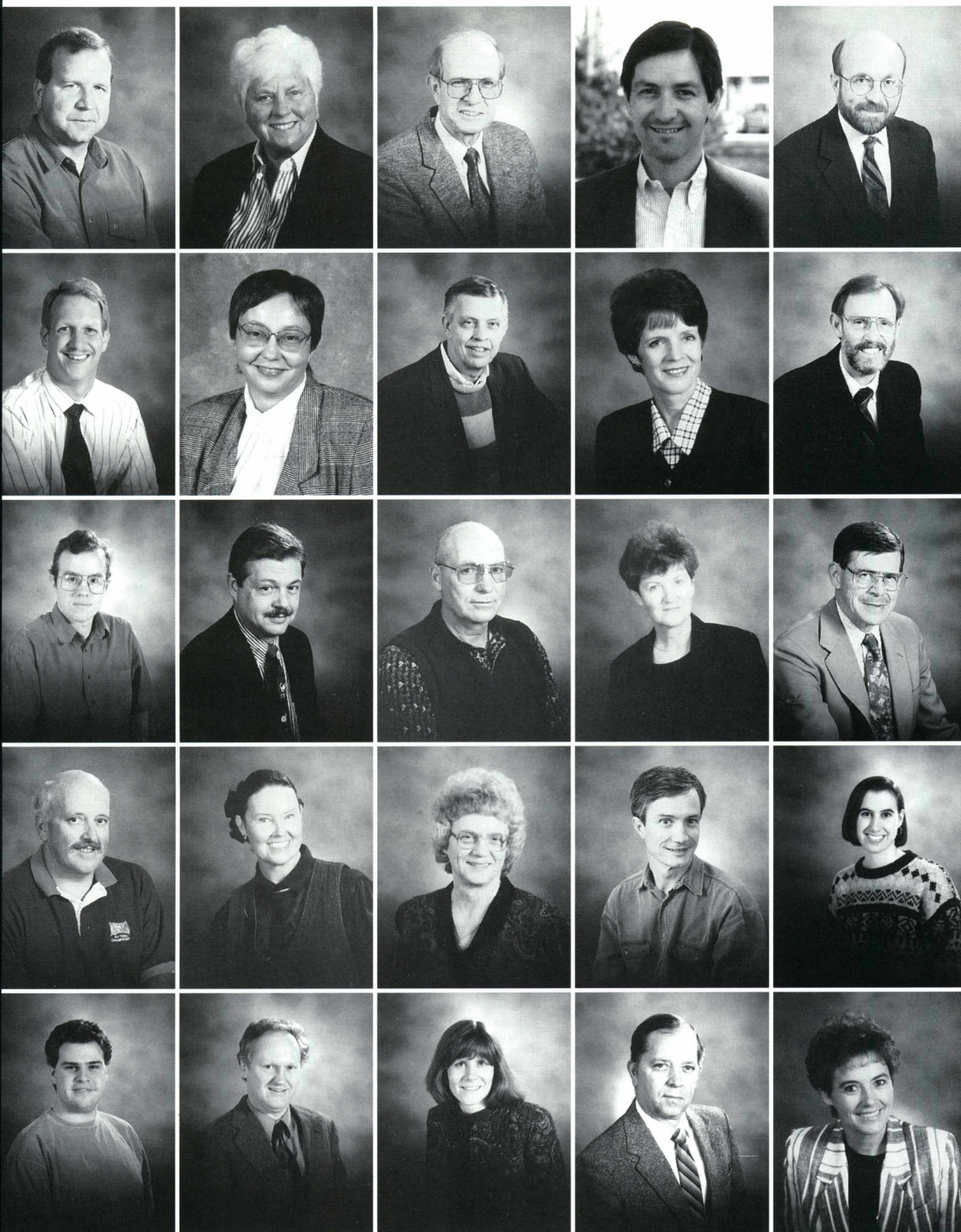

Almost every student participated in a club or an organization. The opportunities for involvement were endless.

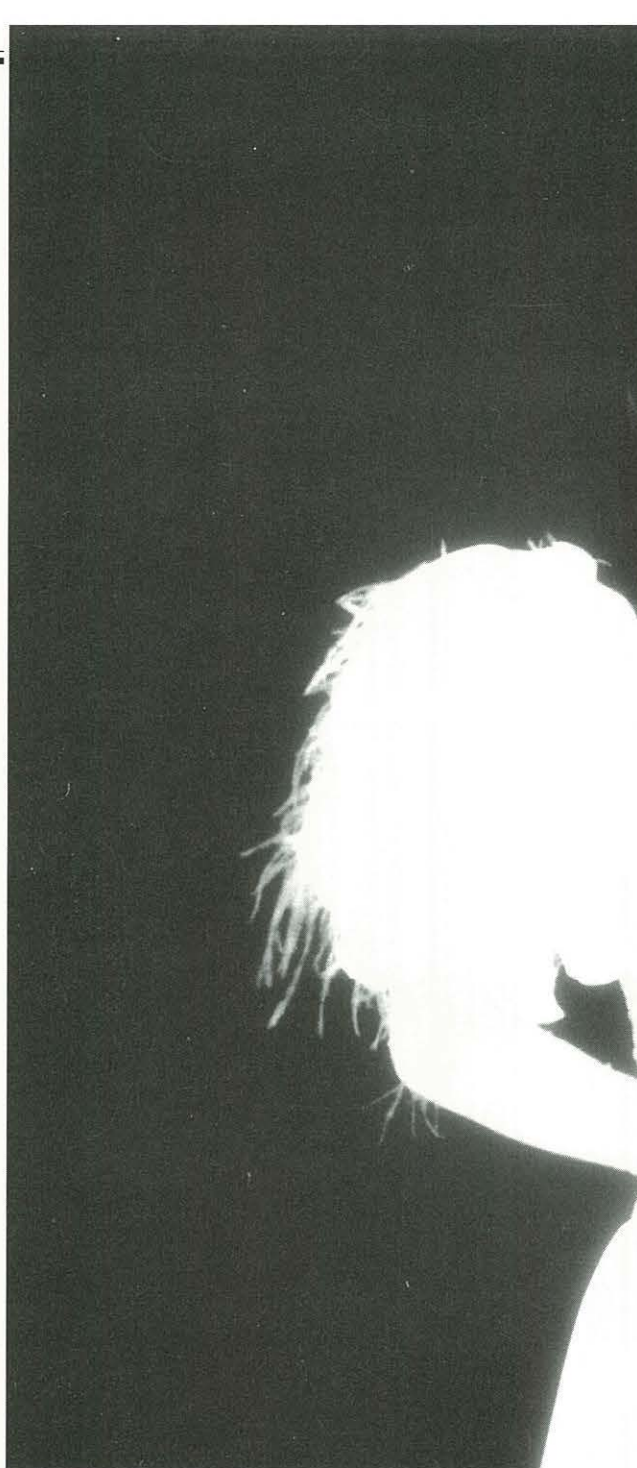

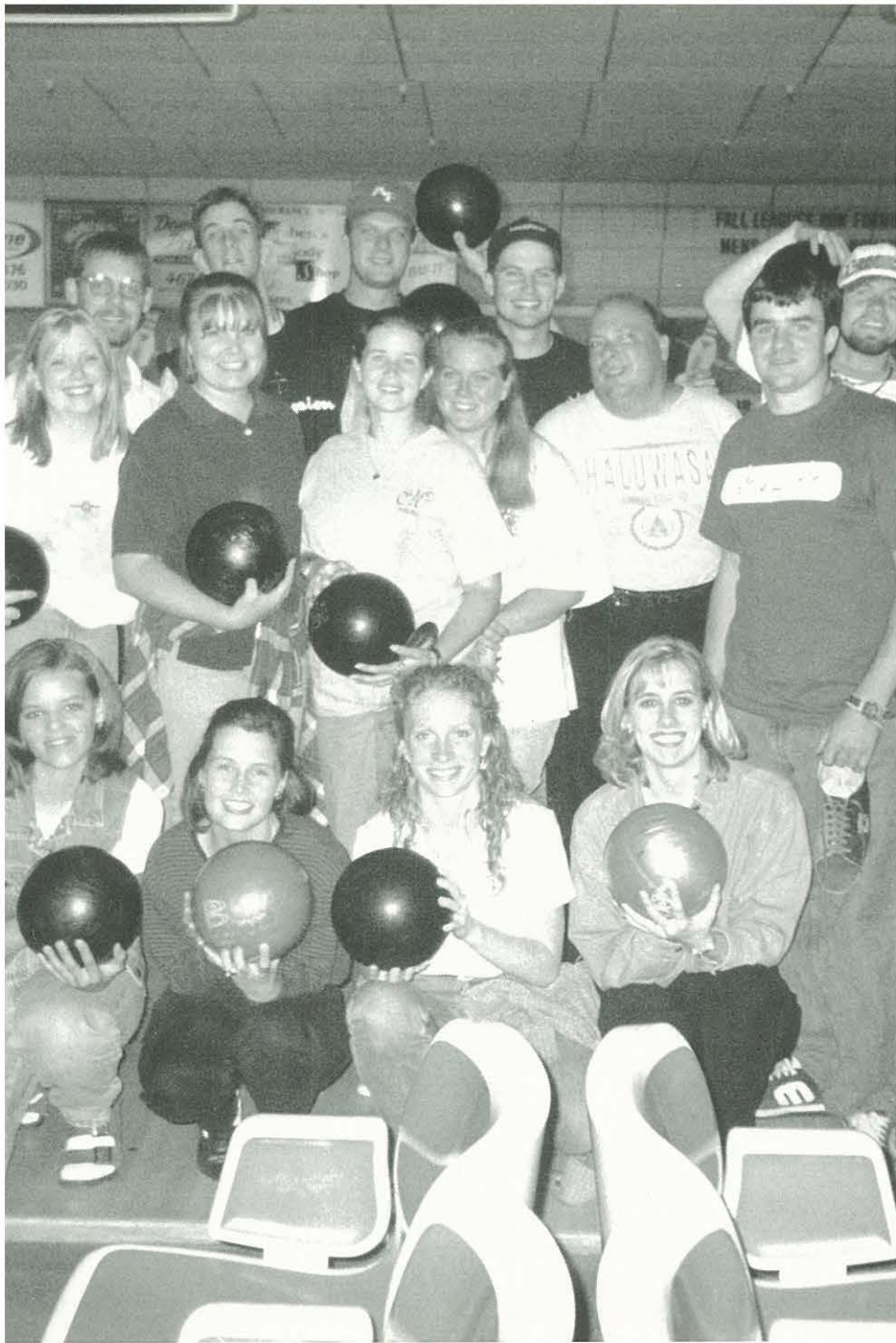

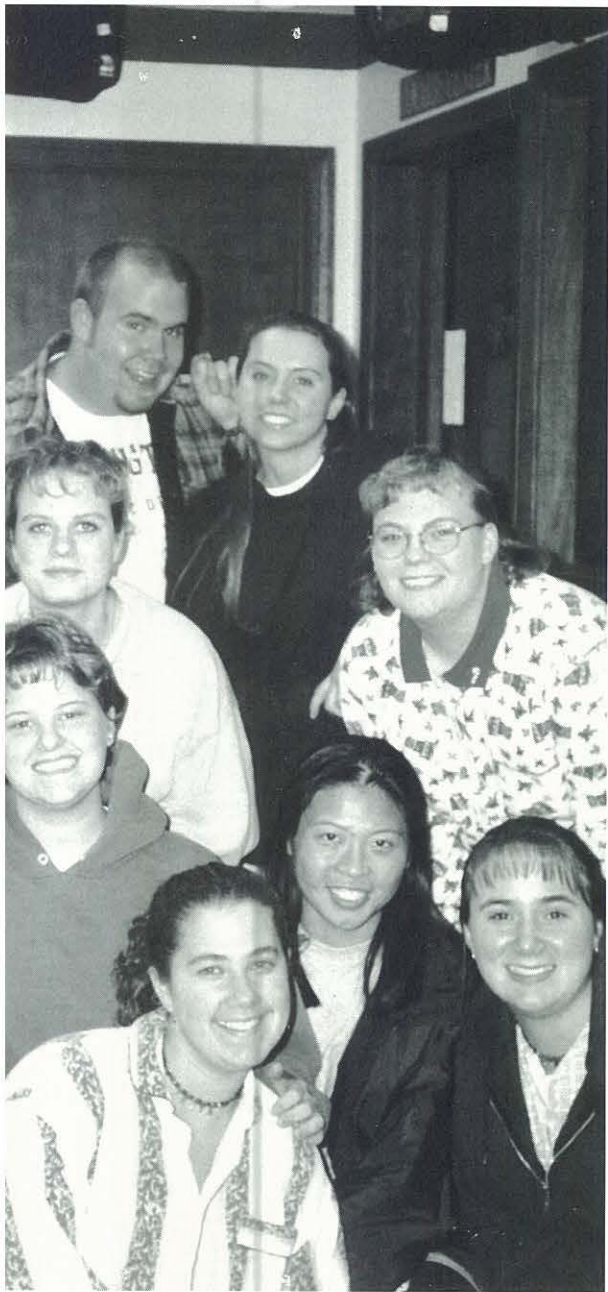

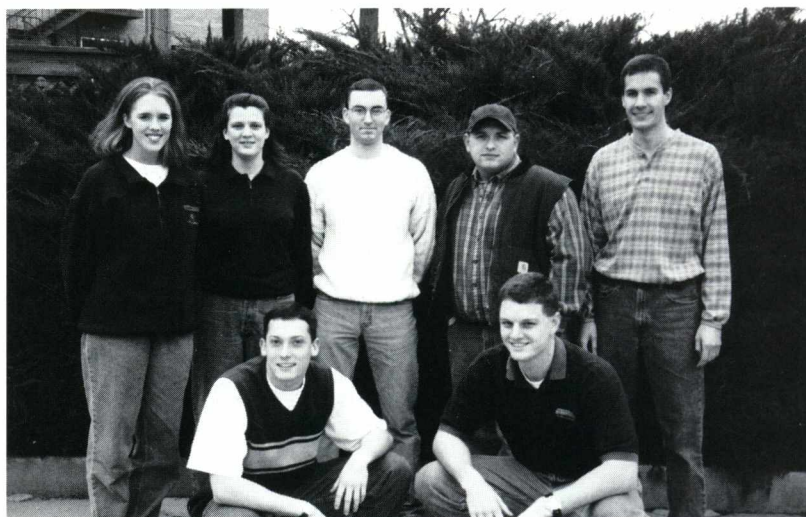

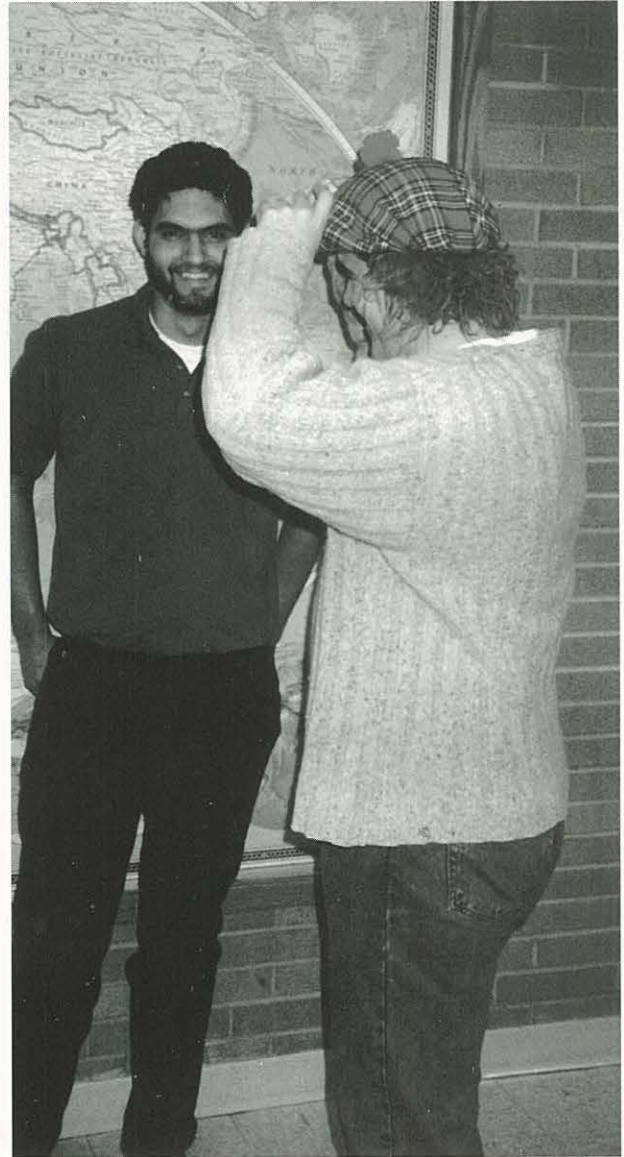

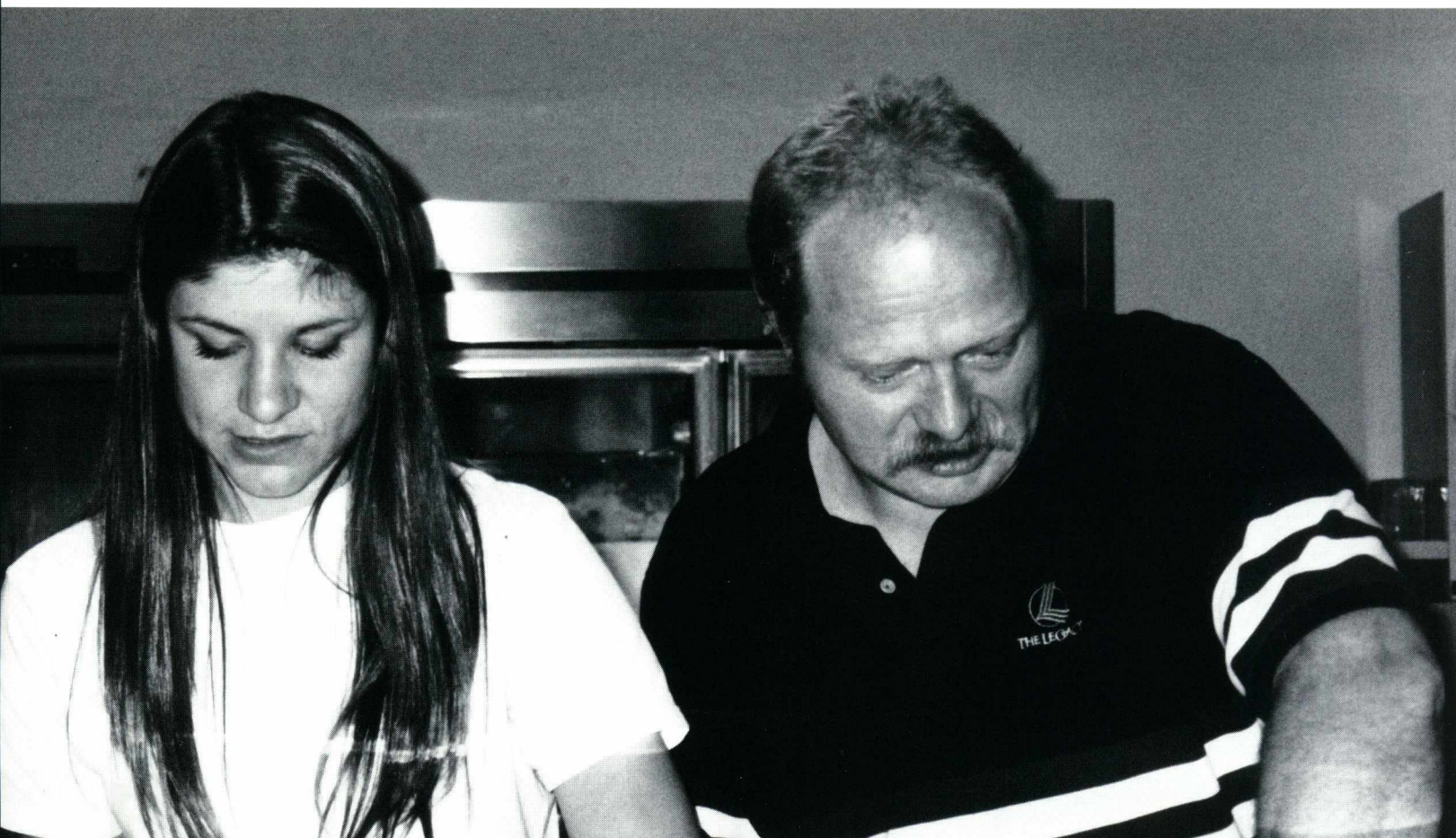

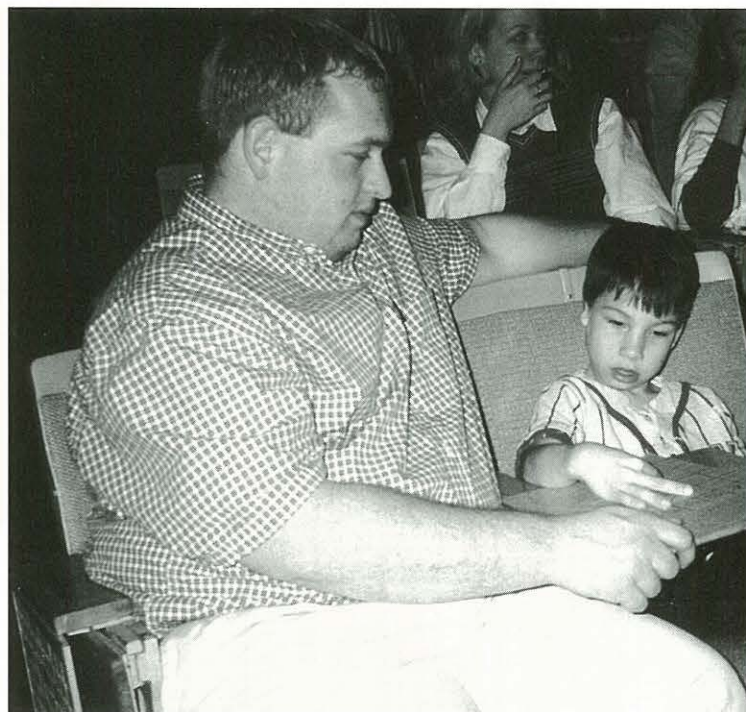

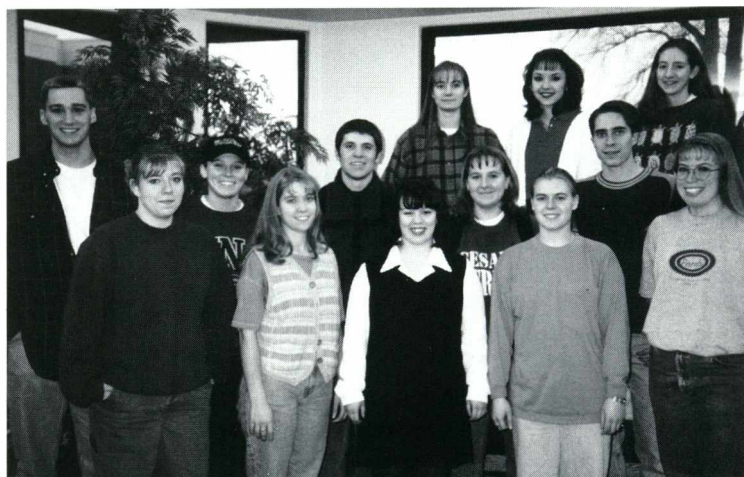

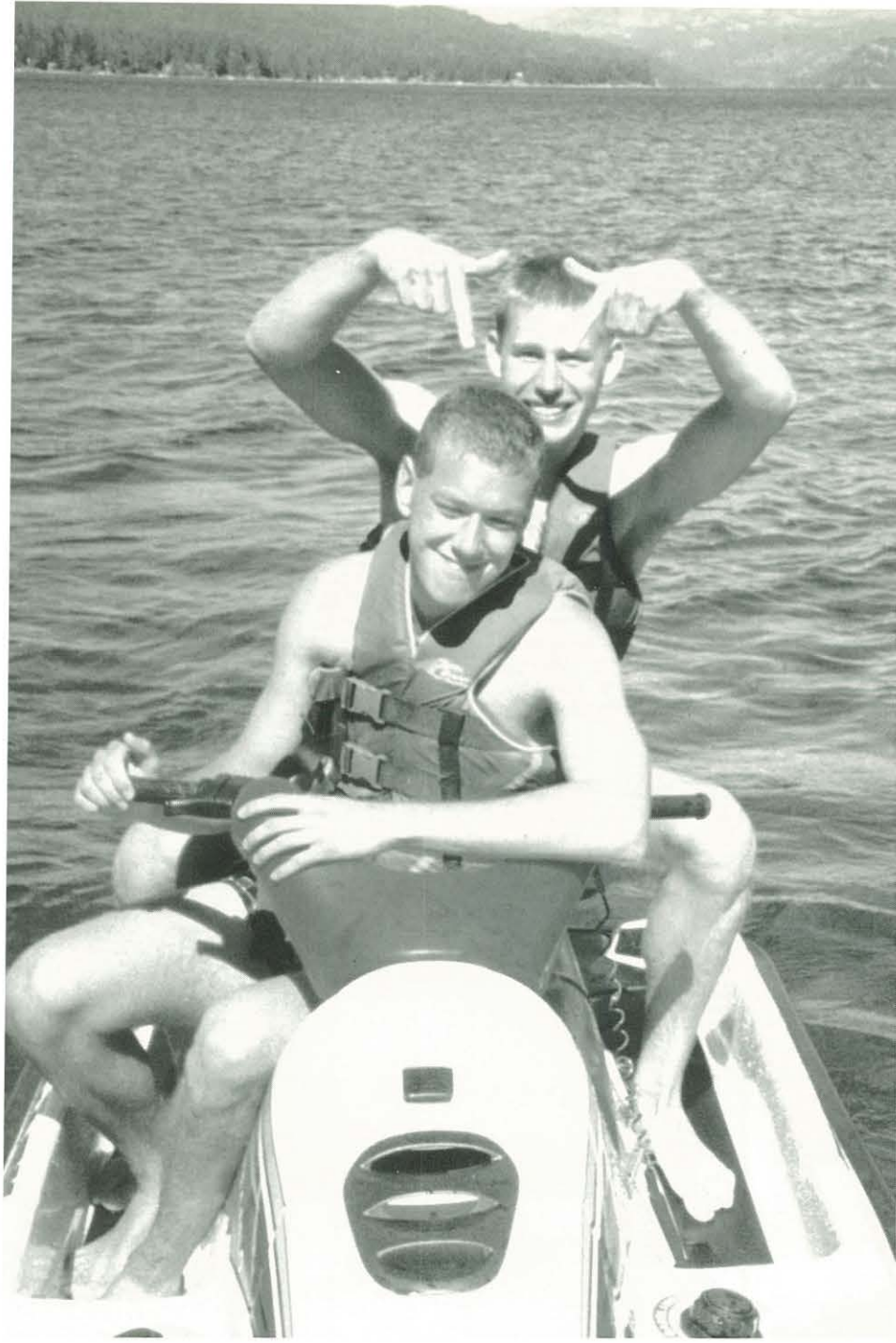

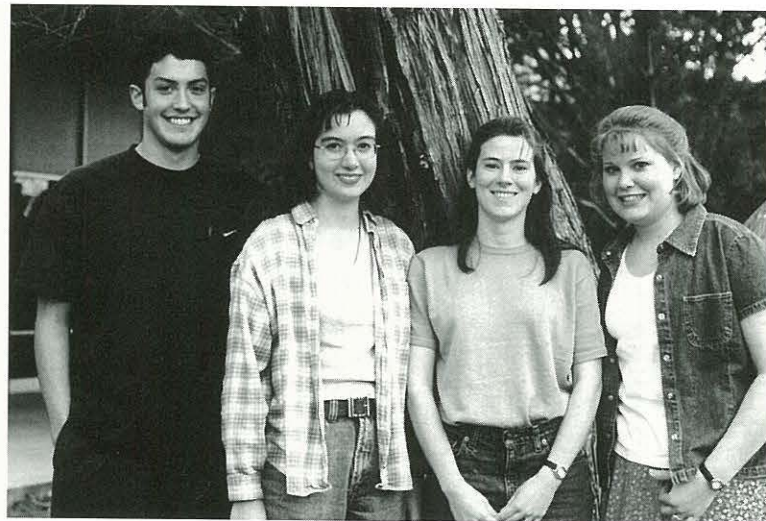

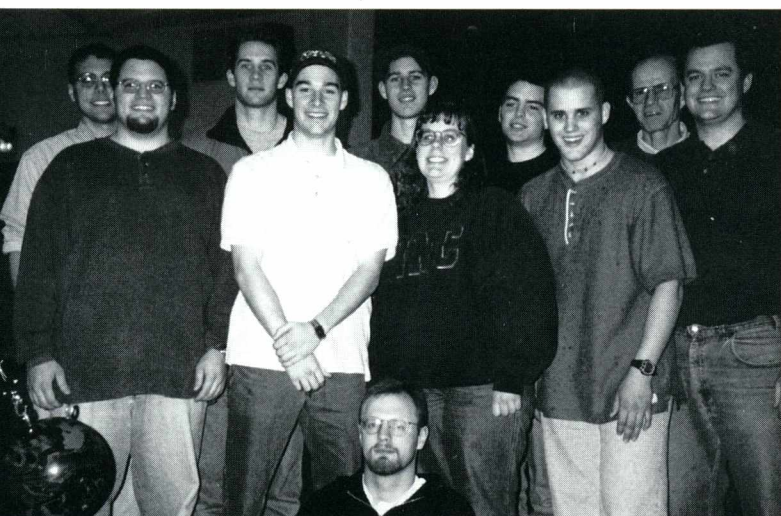

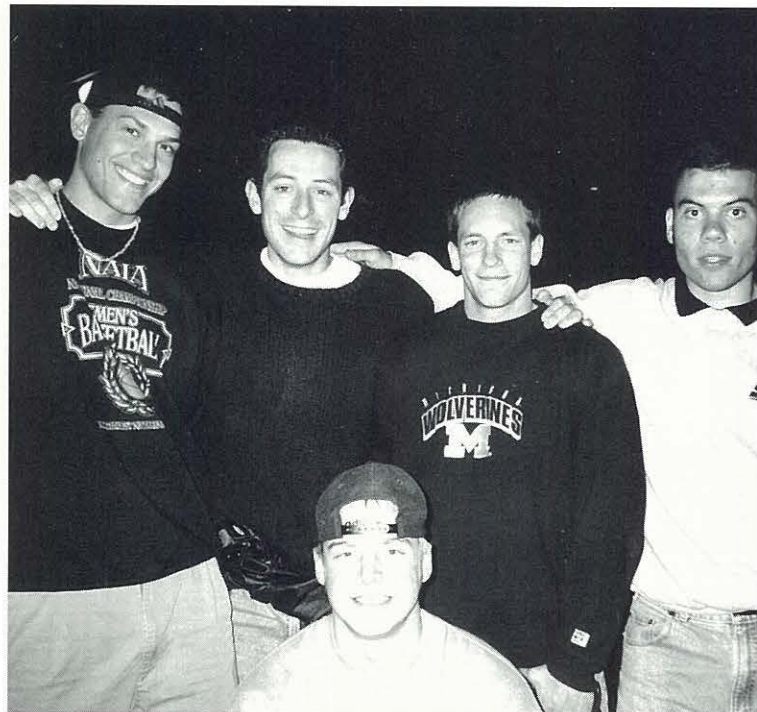

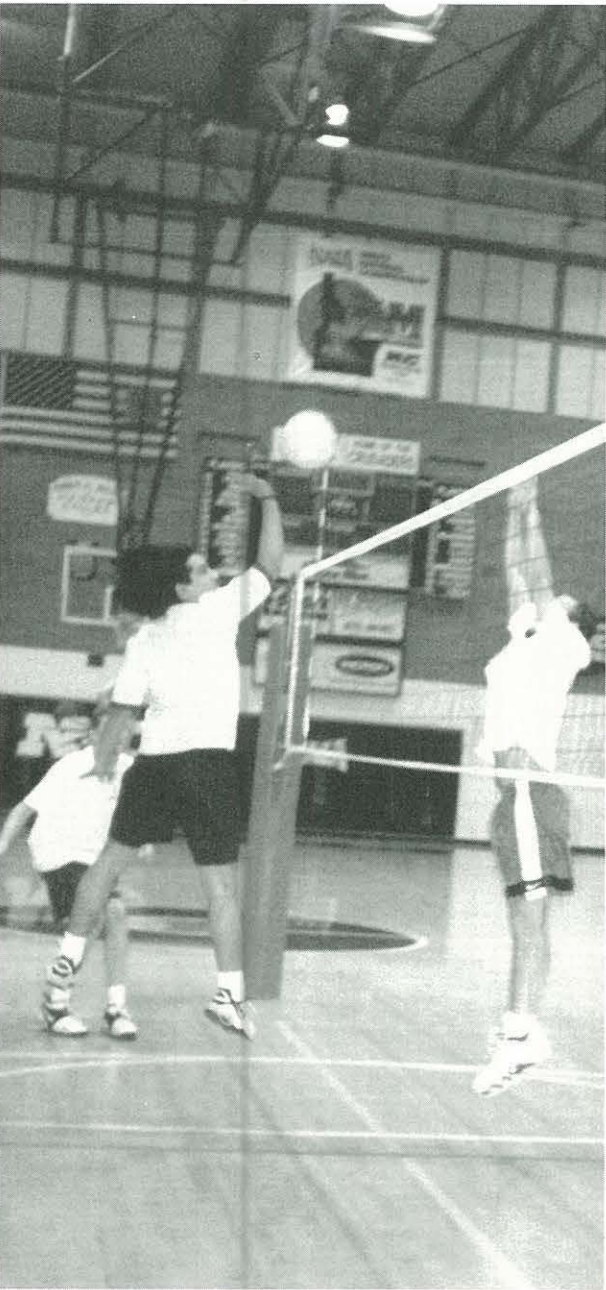

VICE-PRESIDENT FOR STUDENT DEVELOPMENT

Although most of the work he does is behind the scenes, students at NNC are impacted daily by the leadership of Dr. Ken Hills, Vice-President for Student Development. He is a committed Christian, a dedicated father, and a visionary leader of Student Development.

Throughout his nine years at NNC Dr. Hills has always been an advocate for students. The first week he was on campus he toured the dorms and was dismayed at their condition. After that tour he shut down Mangum Hall for remodeling. He was also concerned that the food service was not meeting the needs of students, and went to bat for students to have the option of an endless meal plan. Dr. Hills was responsible for creating a counseling position for the first time at NNC.

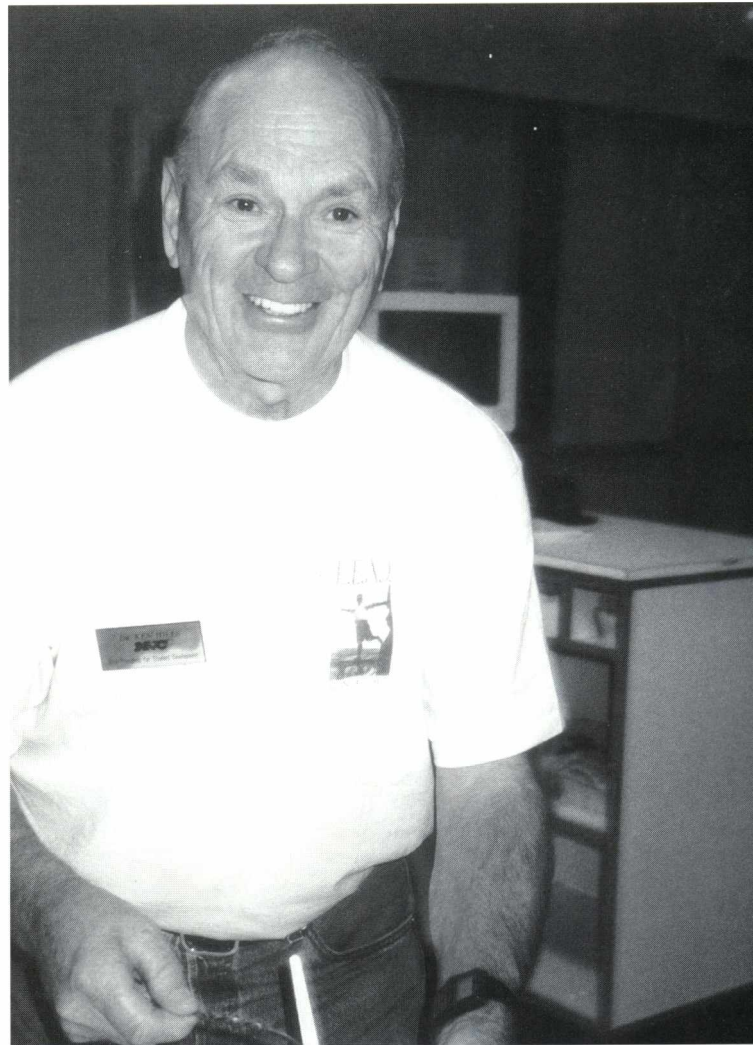
Born in Twin Falls, and raised there and in Jerome, Dr. Hills decided to remain in Idaho for college. In the fall of 1948 he entered Northwest Nazarene College where he earned a degree in history. While at NNC he met and married his wife, Marilyn. The couple had their first daughter, Brandy, their senior year in college, and were later blessed with four more children: Rich, Laurie, Rob, and Linda.

Dr. Hills taught elementary and junior high school in Boise for nine years before moving to Laramie, Wyoming to attend the University of Wyoming. There he attained his Masters Degree and Ph.D. in Counseling and Psychology.

In 1964 the Hills moved to Eugene where Dr. Hills worked as a school psychologist, and as the director of counseling at Lane Community College. He also worked for the University of Oregon and for the Oregon State Department. While he was in Eugene he was on a team which developed a program called Career Information Systems, which is still being used in schools.

In 1978 the Hills moved to San Diego where Dr. Hills served as the Vice President for Student Development until he moved to Nampa to take the same position at NNC in 1989.

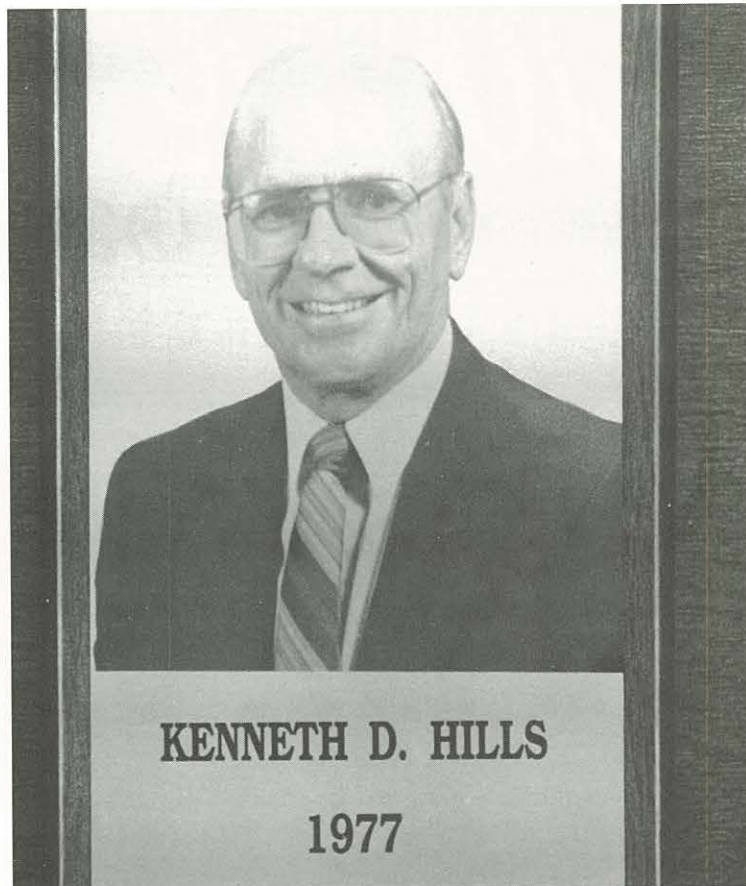
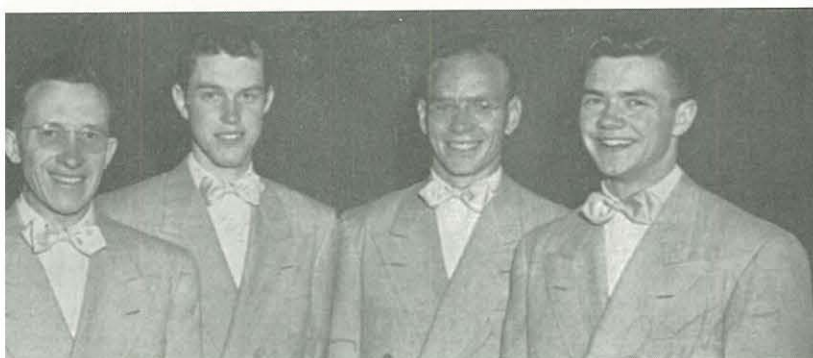
